Newsletter: Double Weekend Issue – 24th & 31st August 2025

This week's newsletter covers two Sundays: 24th August (21st Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C) and 31st August (22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C).

Week 1 – 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

Whenever the Bible says, "the last shall be first and the first last," it means that our place or status in this world doesn't help us get into heaven or find salvation. Jesus always uses this phrase to teach the same lesson: who we are or what we've achieved here on earth isn't what matters most. Eternal life is for anyone who truly trusts in Him, repents, and commits themselves to Him.

Sometimes, we misunderstand what it means to "believe in Jesus." In the original Greek, "believe" also means "to trust," "to have faith," or "to depend on." So, when Jesus asks us to believe in Him, He's really asking us to trust and depend on Him — to commit ourselves to Him, not just know about Him. Having a high status or being "first" in life doesn't guarantee eternal life unless you trust in Christ. On the other hand, those who might seem "last" or less important in this world can gain eternal life simply by faith and may receive great rewards in heaven for their faithful service.

Week 2 - 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Was Jesus trying to criticize the Pharisees with the words, "For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted"? His real message is that we should look at ourselves and recognise our pride. As someone once said, "Pride is about who is right, but humility is about what is right." Jesus taught us what is right — and the humble person will follow His example, while the proud person will make excuses or think they know better.

Jesus is the perfect example of humility. He humbled Himself by becoming human and dying on the cross to save us. There's nothing we can do, now or ever, to repay Him for this incredible act.

This week's Gospel shows how much the Pharisees disliked Jesus. Most of them rejected Him and even helped to have Him killed. Their pride kept them from accepting Christ because they saw themselves as better than Him. It's important to ask ourselves: are we proud or humble? If you're humble, the next step is to become a truly Christian by believing in Jesus and accepting Him as Lord and Savior.

MESSAGE RE DAY OF PRAYER FOR GAZA SUNDAY 24TH AUGUST

At the opening of the Jubilee of Youth in St Peter's Square, Pope Leo XIV said: "We must cry out for peace in the world", he invited all the young people to join him in saying: "We want peace in the world!" In the words of Cardinal Pizzaballa, the Latin Patriarch of Jerusalem: "Christ is not absent from Gaza. He is there, crucified in the wounded, buried under rubble and yet present in every act of mercy, every candle in the darkness, every hand extended to the suffering". The images we are watching on nightly news bulletins and on social media feeds are appalling. Many ask what can we do? We can become numb in our sense of helplessness before scenes that speak of "man's inhumanity to man". We feel bewildered when we see and hear about people crushed by hunger or crushed in the stampede for airdropped food. Most upsetting of all is the horrible violence and death that children are experiencing and witnessing. Archbishop Eamon Martin has called on parishes to set aside **Sunday**, **24 August** as a day of prayer and reflection for Gaza. I echo his call and ask all our parishes in Kildare & Leighlin to observe this day of prayer. We can light a candle in our family home or local parish church; attend Mass, spend time before the Blessed Sacrament; pray the Rosary; make some small personal penance or sacrifice, and on that day "let the light of hope radiate out from the island of Ireland for peace, for Gaza and for the future of its people." **XDenis**

Choose nectar and pollen-rich plants for your garden. There are plenty of beautiful plants you can choose for your garden that are rich in nectar and pollen. Outside your garden, the best action for pollinators is to create biodiversity meadows and margins by reducing mowing. IDEA: Plant bulbs such as Snowdrop, Crocus, and Grape Hyacinth in the autumn to provide early food for emerging pollinators the following spring. Or plant five fruit trees to create a mini orchard.
