The Importance of Church Hospitality

On this the Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C we are reminded that hospitality has a special place in the life of God's people. Hospitality in the church in not just being polite; it is the fundamental aspect of Christian life that reflects the Gospel. It serves to welcome newcomers and existing members, fostering a sense of belonging and community. In God's word to us today we hear; Abraham welcomes the three guests in our first reading, and in the Gospel Martha and Mary welcome Jesus into their home. In both stories, hospitality played a significant role; people feel welcomed, food was shared and a lessen was learned. Does that remind you of anything?

When we come together on a Sunday to celebrate the Eucharist should we not feel welcomed, should we not participate in the Eucharist and receive the bread of life in Holy Communion, should we not leave the church feeling that we are leaving different from when we entered. But I am left wondering to myself; How many of us feel welcomed today? Do we share food in the body of Christ at communion? Do you leave with a sense that you are different after learning something new to encourage you in your life and in your faith?

Hospitality is deeply rooted in Jesus' own ministry and should be deep rooted in us as a faith community. What can we do to make people feel welcome, to feel that they belong? What steps can we make to intentionally welcome people to our Sunday gatherings.

For me, incorporating effective hospitality practices in our church is vital for creating a welcoming atmosphere that reflects the love of Christ. By implementing practical ways, introduction of hospitality ministry; welcoming all at the doors of our church, organising and inviting people to the parish centre for a cup of tea/coffee and a chat after mass. By having a commitment to hospitality, we can foster a sense of belonging and community among our members and visitors alike, maximizing the potential within people to see their visit to our beautiful church as a step towards becoming missionary disciples of Jesus.

This is the challenge for us all today!
