Reflection for 20th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The words spoken by Jesus in the gospel reading of today should cause anyone to shudder. Jesus says that "I have come to bring fire on earth and how I wish it was already kindled already". Yet, Jesus does not mince words when he says that he has come to bring fire on earth because that is exactly what happens when anyone answers the call to discipleship, or accepts to be the the call of Lord as evidenced in the story of Jeremiah in the first reading.

The Israelite king and rulers agreed to enter into an alliance with their neighbors to form a formidable army against impending invasion of the powerful Babylonia. This alliance with their pagan neighbours was against the will of God for the Israelite nation. As God's mouthpiece, Jeremiah warned the Israelite rulers that such alliance is not the will of God for them. Their hope for survival lies, not in any military powers but in faithful reliance on the power of God to save his people.

This prophecy of Jeremiah did not sit well with the Israelite leadership and because of this, they tried to silence him. He was denounced as unpatriotic. He was thrown into an empty underground water cistern so that he might eventually die of starvation. Jesus prepares our minds for situations like this in the gospel reading of today. Being a follower of Jesus comes with a very price especially in our world of today. Ours is a world which has chosen to become deaf to the gospel message. The gospel message is seen by many today is redundant and unimportant. Many today would question why anyone of us need to continue believing in a God when we can just continue to rely on our own schemings as human beings. Because of this, to be on the side of the truth or being the mouthpiece of God can make us become very unpopular. When we choose to stand on the side of God, even our friends and loved ones can turn their backs on us. Do we then need to abandon our prophetic calling so as to fit and feel accepted by those who would otherwise have opposed us. Jesus reminds us that whoever would be his follower would need to deny him/herself, take up his/her cross and follow him.

Are you still ready to be a follower of Christ after this?

MESSAGE RE DAY OF PRAYER FOR GAZA SUNDAY 24TH AUGUST

At the opening of the Jubilee of Youth in St Peter's Square, Pope Leo XIV said: "We must cry out for peace in the world", he invited all the young people to join him in saying: "We want peace in the world!" In the words of Cardinal Pizzaballa, the Latin Patriarch of Jerusalem: "Christ is not absent from Gaza. He is there, crucified in the wounded, buried under rubble and yet present in every act of mercy, every candle in the darkness, every hand extended to the suffering". The images we are watching on nightly news bulletins and on social media feeds are appalling. Many ask what can we do? We can become numb in our sense of helplessness before scenes that speak of "man's inhumanity to man". We feel bewildered when we see and hear about people crushed by hunger or crushed in the stampede for air-

hunger or crushed in the stampede for air-dropped food. Most upsetting of all is the horrible violence and death that children are experiencing and witnessing. Archbishop Eamon Martin has called on parishes to set aside **Sunday**, **24** August as a day of prayer and reflection for Gaza. I echo his call and ask all our parishes in Kildare & Leighlin to observe this day of prayer. We can light a candle in our family home or local parish church; attend Mass, spend time before the Blessed Sacrament; pray the Rosary; make some small personal penance or sacrifice, and on that day "let the light of hope radiate out from the island of Ireland for peace, for Gaza and for the future of its people." **XDenis**
