RE-OPENING OF PARISH CHURCH FOR PUBLIC MASS

It is with great pleasure that we are preparing to re-open our churches for Mass. Initially St. Joseph's Church will be open. We must endeavour to do all we can to make our church safe in the interest of everybody's heath and safety. Guidelines have been issued by the Bishop which must be adhered to throughout the diocese.

Masses will resume on the weekend 4th/5th July with Mass at 6pm on Saturday and 11am on Sunday. We had been planning to have as many people as possible using 2 metre safe distancing and allowing for more than one person coming from the same household. Unfortunately after yesterday's Government announcement numbers are restricted to 50. This poses problems for us which we will have to try to overcome.

As the obligation to attend Mass on Sat/Sun is lifted at present we are recommending that people choose to attend Mass on one of the seven days of the week. Weekends could then be used by those not in a position to attend on a weekday.

BE PREPARED—IT WILL BE DIFFERENT!

- Stewards will escort you to your seat.
- The church will be filled from front to back.
- There are markers on the seat where you may sit.
- For Communion, please stand if you wish to receive. The Priest or Minister will go to your seat.
- At the end of Mass the church will empty from back to front following steward's instructions.
- While in the church, face coverings are recommended but not mandatory.
- Social distancing guidelines to be followed at all times.

REOPENING OF CHURCES FOR PUBLIC MASS

In responding to the issuing of the 'Framework Document for a Return to the Public Celebration of Mass and the Sacraments' Bishop Nulty said the following....

"What we are undertaking is unprecedented. But our objective goes to the heart of who we are as a Christian community. We are readying ourselves to physically gather once more around the table of the Lord. In these past months, as a Christian community we have hungered for a presence; the presence of Christ in the gathering of the community and in the Eucharist.

While the Church has continued to live and breathe through the charitable outreach of parishes, in the setting of the domestic Church of the family, and via an extraordinary array of online Masses and prayer services, we have felt deeply the loss of this presence. As a Confirmation candidate wrote in a letter to me, 'Online Mass is good but it is even better when you get to go in real life'. We know the truth of these words.

The immediate work ahead of us is focused on bringing us back into the Eucharistic presence of the Lord and one another. This is essential to who we are as followers of Jesus. When we gather it will be different. We will need to be patient with ourselves and with one another as we come to terms with a new 'normal', an evolving way of being together. We must not undo the enormous good achieved by the sacrifices we have all made to date. As we make the necessary practical arrangements for a safe return to public worship, we must share a common commitment to maintaining safe practices in our parishes. These safe practices should not deter us from continuing to share in the mission of Christ in whatever circumstances we find ourselves.

This is a time of great challenge but it is also a time of grace, a time of new possibilities, a time of shared solidarity. God is with us, we need not be afraid."
