

CANONISATION OF CARDINAL JOHN HENRY NEWMAN



John Henry Newman will be canonised as a new saint of the Catholic Church today by Pope Francis in Rome. Born in London in 1801, he studied in Oxford, converted to Catholicism and was ordained a priest. At the invitation of the Irish bishops he became rector of the Catholic University in Dublin which led to the foundation of what is today UCD. In 1879 he was made a Cardinal and by the time of his death in Birmingham in 1890 it was said that more than any other person he had changed the attitude of non-Catholics towards Catholics in England.

The Baltinglass Connection

Very Rev. Dr. Denis Kane D.D., V.G. became Parish Priest of Baltinglass in 1871. He had a most tender devotion to St. Philip Neri. He once wrote that he 'gloried to be under the shadow of St. Philip'. On his death-bed he prayed most fervently to "dear St. Philip", to whom he acknowledged he was so much indebted. Because of his devotion to St. Philip he struck up a lasting friendship with Cardinal Newman, himself a devotee of the saint.

On the death of Dr. Kane, in July 1883, he wrote:

"Dear Professor Murphy,

I am much pained to hear of Dr. Kane's death. It recalls to my mind the friendly and familiar intercourse I had with him so many years ago. At that time Cardinal Cullen sanctioned the prospect of the establishment of a house of the Oratory at Dublin, and Dr. Kane was one of those who showed special interest in the undertaking. And now I hear of his death. I have the most pleasant and affectionate recollections of him. God rest his soul, or rather, may he pray for us.

Your faithful servant,

John H. Card. Newman."

"P.S. I am much touched to be told of his people's intended altar to our great St. Philip Neri, in his parish church. May I offer £5 for that object." (Altar and statue on right side-aisle)

Perhaps Newman's most famous prayer is the following:

Prayer for Perseverance

May Christ support us all day long, till shades lengthen and the evening comes and the busy world is hushed and a fever of life is over and our work is done.

Then in his mercy may he give us safe lodging, a holy rest and peace at last. Amen.
