RE-OPENING OF ST. JOSEPH'S CHURCH

The church will be open daily from 10am to 4pm.

An area at the back of the church has been prepared to facilitate safe distancing and people will only have access to this area. This is to avoid people having access to all of the church and to assist in daily cleaning.

- Enter by the main door. Please leave doors open.
- Keep your distance (2m apart).
- Use hand sanitiser.
- Avoid unnecessary touching of surfaces.
- While praying (to minimise touching of surfaces):
 Stand if you can.

Sit if you must (or wish to).

• Lighting of Candles.

Light from the existing lighted candle or with your own lighter. (Lighters cannot be provided for hygiene reasons).

Most of us know what it's like to be parting company from another whom we love and wondering if we will ever see them again.

Well, today Jesus is preparing his disciples for his leaving them and so our Gospel has a sad, yet wonderful atmosphere to it.

Jesus tells them this is not the end and in doing so is telling us too. There is more to us than

our material lives -we each have an inner, spiritual aspect and our lives on earth are a preparation for the place Jesus has prepared for each of us for "There are many Rooms in my Father's house". Our earthly existence is not permanent. Christ became flesh and he too had to move on from this life.

Thomas questions Jesus "We do not know where you are going so how can we know the way? And so we hear the beautiful consoling words from Jesus "I am the Way, the Truth and the Life".

We tend to look outwardly for the Way just as the disciples did but the "Kingdom of Heaven is within." Philip wants to see the Father even though Christ has been teaching him and with him for so long. Everything Christ is and says is from the Father for I am in the Father and the Father is in me". Christ has nothing his own no more that we have, nor can we do anything of value on our own.

Our Gospel today may be tinged with sadness, mystery and wonder but it invites us today to "Trust in God still, and trust in me".
