

Everything in nature has a time, a rhythm, a natural cycle, a season. This is also true of spiritual development. In today's gospel we see that the time of the disciples has not yet come. These are the people who gave up everything for Christ. They were his students and also his friends and despite being trained by him they still did not fully understand what Jesus said.

Jesus promised to send the Holy Spirit, the same spirit which descended on the head of Jesus when he was baptised by John the Baptist. Only then will the disciples understand that "I am in the Father & you in me and I in you".

Jesus was fully human and we are invited to grow towards this fullness which leads us to respect one another, keeping our focus on the being of the person, on God, and less on ourselves. Anything that separates us from Jesus needs to be emptied out or removed. Our fulfilment comes through Christ, as we are asked to leave our old way of life behind. We all make mistakes and it is humbling to admit them but also to learn from them. We are called to say only what praises God and only what uplifts another. There is a whole new life awaiting to dawn on us as we await Pentecost-Baptism in the spirit. And each day has its own time, rhythm, cycle and season. Just as our spiritual life has within.
