'The Breaking of Loaves.' (Today's Gospel)

I love going to the bakery section in the supermarket to look at the variety of breads on offer, firstly greeted by the fantastic smell and then by the feast of creativity on display. Bail ó Dhia ar an obair.

Well, today's gospel is about "the breaking of loaves". This is a story symbolic of how Jesus himself is broken and shared among us - a broken humanity. We celebrate this when we attend the Eucharist as we relive the gospel story over and over.

Yes, it's going on continually, Jesus - our Bread, our spiritual food is continually dying and resurrecting in us. He is brought to us in a Special way as we share communion together, yes, we are all on the common ground of God's love.

We live this Eucharist or continue living this Eucharist as we meet other people and connect with them, maybe sharing stories, a greeting, a wave, a smile, reaching out to those in need, our sharing - listening and compassion, creating a sacred space with others.

We too, like Jesus need to withdraw to a 'lonely' place to reflect, compose and centre ourselves, to meditate.
