When you have a party invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind."

It is most wonderful to give to others and not get found out. Many times I may be boasting about my generosity, announcing what I have done for others, how much I have given to charity or some kindness I have shown.

Well today's gospel tells us 'when we have a party invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind'. Invite the people who cannot repay you, people from whom you want nothing in return. It is good to encourage our children to do likewise - maybe helping out another student at school, encouraging one another rather than being so competitive.

Let us strive for wholeness and holiness in the little things and events of every day life—as a student, as parents, a friend, at work...wherever. There is a great happiness in giving of material things, of giving our time to a lonely person, of giving our love. This is the Kingdom of Heaven at work in a practical way. It is very freeing to have no expectations of anyone. "When you have a party invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind".

What can I do for another person today and not get found out? An act of kindness, a gift, a look of love, a prayer...and the place to begin is in your own home.
