FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

The phrase, "I love you" is a saying that is misused very often in our society today. People have said these words to us and we have said it to others as well. Yet, if we think critically about our use of the word, "I love you" we will admit that, in many cases, it is only for self-interest; I love because of what I hope to get in return. Love, in its true meaning implies, not self-interest but rather, a giving of oneself. This is what the readings of today's liturgy invite us to.

In the gospel reading, Jesus commands us to love one another he has loved us. It is significant to note that Jesus gave this commandment while he was eating the last supper with his disciples. Jesus gave a practical example of what it means to love by going to the cross to die. He loves us so much that he gave up his own life for us to live. By going to the cross, Jesus fulfils his mission, a mission which is primarily to give life to the world through his own death. In this way, Jesus acts in complete accordance with the will and purpose of God the Father and that is why he says in the gospel reading that "now has the Son of Man been glorified, and in him God has been glorified". Love meant that Jesus participated in the saving work of the Father.

True love then, is a participation in the saving mission of God which was begun in Christ. As heard in the second reading of today, Paul and Barnabas preached and laboured extensively in the establishment of the Christian communities in gentile territories. By this, Paul and Barnabas also participated in the salvific mission of mission of God. This mission of God is for the salvation of everyone.

Next time when I say to someone "I love you", I should ask myself whether I am ready to give myself wholly so that the other person may come to know and love God better or whether it is because I hope to get something in return.

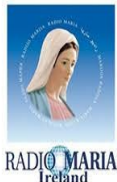

TOP TEN WAYS TO HELP POLLINATORS: MANAGE AND PLANT NATIVE HEDGEROWS FOR BIODIVERSITY

The more blossom your hedgerow has in Spring, the better it is for biodiversity. Allow hedges to grow into a natural A-shape profile rather than a neat box shape.

Why: Native hedgerow plants such as Hawthorn (also called Whitethorn), and Blackthorn flower early in Spring, providing vital food for wild bees when they emerge from hibernation. Birds and mammals eat their berries later in autumn.
