In today's gospel, Jesus assures us that as God's people, we have a share in his heritage. This heritage is God's kingdom. Christ alleged our fears by encouraging us not to be afraid and called us "little flock," which means my beloved people. He did not stop at this but went further to bring us the good news from our Father: "...For it has pleased your Father to give you the Kingdom." This is the climax of today's message.

However, as the people of God, Christ warns us to be watchful. This is a necessary condition for us to obtain this kingdom which is our heritage. Therefore, as God's people, we must live lives that bear good testimony to our Father and those we live with.

This life is a life of watchfulness! Watchfulness here simply means being conscious of who we are. It means cherishing and safeguarding our heritage. The mark of this life is our faith! It is only through it that we can be that: "Happy people that the Lord has chosen as his own."

There is a story about a monk who one day was sweeping the monastery floor when one of his students asked him what he would do if told that he would die within the hour. His reply was: I would go on sweeping the floor.' In other words, he would go on attending to the duty of the moment. That's what being prepared means.
