### REFLECTION FOR THE THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - YEAR C

The Gospel reading presents the story of a Pharisee and a tax collector which contains a critique of those who "trusted in themselves that they were righteous". Righteousness refers to the right relationship with God and others, and the story served Jesus to show how such a right relationship might be developed.

The Tax collector had no merits. He pleaded for restoration, relying only on God's grace to be accepted into God's presence. Jesus teaches that this is the correct attitude when it comes to building one's relationship with God. No one can force God to show grace and love. It comes to those who, like the tax collector, humbly accept their complete dependence on God. Such attitude makes the bond with God flourish and grow, while the overconfidence and pretentious attitude of the Pharisees disrupts it. We do not know whether the tax collector changed his life. But he certainly made the first and essential step towards conversion, which is the point of the story.

Today's readings teach that it is essential for believers to choose wisely what to rely upon. Sirach showed that economic and social status cannot be used as reliable markers of righteousness, which comes through prayer and works of mercy. Paul made a wise choice in life and completed his long and difficult mission, relying on Jesus rather than on human beings. As he neared the end of his life he rejoiced because he wisely chose who to rely upon. Relying on his merits, the Pharisee felt entitled to stand in God's presence and expected God's favour. But Jesus teaches that the right relationship with God is built not upon one's merits but upon humble reliance on his mercy and grace, which the tax collector exemplified. This teaching is reflected well in the words of the Psalmist, "none of those who take refuge in him will be condemned."
